

## F.P. Walshe Leadership Goal

F.P. Walshe (FPW) leadership, as measured by the Measurable Results Assessment (MRA), will increase from 75% to 78% by May 2025.

#### **Lead measures/Strategies**

- 1. Continue to work under the "we are all learning support" model.
- 2. School staff leading professional learning sessions.
- 3. Student leaders participating and contributing to school committees (ie. school council, party in the park, etc.)
- 4. Implement a teacher led 'collaborative inquiry' model during PLC time.
- 5. Continue to utilize a collaborative response model within our learning support framework while utilizing data to guide conversations.
- 6. Weekly student leadership meetings and involvement in the school improvement cycle.
- 7. Continue to distribute leadership roles including: literacy lead, numeracy lead, PLC leads, CRM leads, Connections lead, and student leadership leaders.
- 8. Provide all stakeholders with opportunities for input in school planning through initiatives including but not limited to: Pizza with Principals, Elder breakfasts, student survey (grade visits), and School Council meetings.
- 9. All students from grades 6-12 setting individual goals.
- 10. Staff professional learning focused on goal setting for students.
- 11. Continue to strengthen community partnership to provide opportunities for student leadership in the community.

#### **LRSD Culture WIG**

## **Lead Measures/Strategies**

- 1. Continue to have a consistent admin presence in classrooms and hallways.
- 2. Continue to provide student led club opportunities.
- 3. Implement Middle School We Are Walshe (WAW) character building focus time.
- 4. School based First Nations Metis and Inuit committee to continue to support foundational knowledge and cultural learning opportunities throughout the year.
- 5. Wellness team to organize staff team building activities.
- 6. Student leadership to continue leading assemblies and school activities.
- 7. Communication and celebration of F.P. Walshe through the school newsletter, newspaper club, assemblies, announcements, & school communication channels.
- 8. Host two celebration of learning nights.
- 9. Continue Connections program to support students from grades 6-12 who require additional support outside of the traditional school environment.
- 10. Continue community partnership initiatives including but not limited to: community BBQs, celebration of learning nights, Party in the Park and community clean-up.
- 11. Continue to utilize a collaborative response model within the school community.
- 12. Continue to gather stakeholder input on school improvement.
- 13. Implement year 3 of the WINGS program along with providing a wide variety of option classes for middle school and high school students including a new exploring the trades course.

#### **LRSD Academics WIG**

LRSD will increase the number of students achieving the acceptable standard in the following assessments by June 2026.

- → Cumulative PAT results will increase from 62.2% to 80% acceptable standard by June 2026.
- → Cumulative -1 DIP results will increase from 67.8% to 95% acceptable standard by June 2026.
- → Cumulative -2 DIP results will increase from 69.4% to 85% acceptable standard by June 2026.

#### **FPW Academics Goal**

FPW academics, as measured by the MRA, will increase from 73% to 76% by May 2024.

#### **Lead Measures/Strategies**

- 1. Timetable construction that prioritizes student learning and achievement.
- 2. Prioritizing hiring and retaining staff that align with our school vision/mission/motto.
- 3. Staff professional learning time focused on instructional practices and high impact pedagogy for student learning.
- 4. Partnership with the University of Lethbridge to support professional literacy/numeracy intervention and student academic achievement.
- 5. Staff professional learning time embedded into staff meetings with input from literacy and numeracy leads.
- 6. Continue with our "we are all learning support" model.
- 7. Implement a weekly collaborative inquiry framework during PLC time.
- 8. Implement a peer to peer teacher observation structure.
- 9. School administration to provide consistent teacher supervision with post-observation feedback to support continuous professional growth.
- 10. Utilize data to support student growth and achievement including but not limited to: star reader, Jerry Johns reading assessment, star math, grade 8 CATS, class grades and class observations.
- 11. Implement a middle school intervention program focused on literacy and numeracy.
- 12. Implement numeracy and literacy plans (developed by teacher leads).
- 13. Provide debrief meetings for PAT and Diploma teachers along with professional learning release time and resources for growth.
- 14. Conference meetings with administration and teachers to support teacher IPGPs.
